Handi-Craft Company, the manufacturer of the Dr. Brown's products, has suggested cleaning guidelines for products purchased in retail, and intended for home use, that include boiling for 5 mins prior to first use. It is understood this is not a practical cleaning option for hospital use, an equally suitable cleaning option for hospital use has been included in the attached document.

Dr. Brown's Medical products (bottle system and nipples) are a reusable bottle system and not intended to be used as a disposable product. The Dr. Brown's Medical team has taken into consideration the hospital/clinical environment and the ability to provide adequate cleaning of the Dr. Brown's products prior to first use and/or after each use. Cleaning guidelines are based on suggestions by the American Dietetic Association.^{*} Reusable feeding products should be cleaned with soap and water, rinsed well, and air dried prior to first use; rinsed immediately after each use, cleaned with soap and water, rinsed well, and air dried; and consider sanitizing/sterilizing once every 24 hours. ALL recommendations provided are intended to be used as a guideline for supporting individual hospital cleaning requirements and/or infection control policies and protocols.
